Periodically throughout each year EMAS sponsors teams to specific locations overseas. These teams have usually been to the location previously and know the needs of the medical community they are going to serve. New members are always welcome to join these teams.

EACH TEAM IS UNIQUE

Each EMAS team is unique. Some include non-Christians, some include only medical personnel. Teams range in size from 2-35. Areas visited include Vietnam, Cuba, Romania, Angola and many locations in China.

As we respond to the needs of our overseas

partners we are careful about sending appropriate people. Level

of skill, complexity of teaching material, length of stay and size of team must all be taken into account when the composition of the team is being finalized. To avoid disappointment, apply early. Six to eight months in advance is appropriate for most teams. Contact the EMAS office for an application.

ADMINISTRATION PROCESS

To meet government requirements each individual needs to complete an application form (available from the EMAS office) and return it to the team leader or the EMAS office. This gives EMAS a database to work from as well as a statement of faith by each participant. It is important that EMAS know who is travelling and what their beliefs are.

Part of the application is a Waiver of Responsibility. This is a necessity in today's legal climate and applications without this properly executed Release will not be considered. Before travelling applicants are required to provide proof of personal insurance .

Applicants will be informed promptly of their acceptance on the team and any further requirements.

Each individual needs to complete and return an application form.
