As we look to the future, we celebrate 70 years of God's faithfulness giving us confidence in His promises.

In Dec 2016, we faced a time of transition, when from within we questioned our ability to survive multiple major leadership changes. We pegged our confidence in the fact that our gospel was insured by God's promises.

2017 began with a warning from our auditors: we were not financially viable as a mission! The Board acted to stabilize operations through a policy that would place EMAS on the path to becoming sustainable; as long as **Christ-centered healthcare teams**


proclaiming God's love to all the world through healing and teaching were interested in serving from within Canada. The board and team leaders were united. They took bold steps to trust God for our future. It was a watershed, and we survived.

Forty years after liberation from slavery, the Hebrew nomads stood at a watershed, and God said, "Get ready to cross the Jordan River into the land." They became a nation settled in their own land as promised by God to their ancestor, Abraham about 400 years prior.

The confidence we had in God's promises in 2016 concerning the

gospel have been reinforced by our experience of safe transition through this past year. God hasn't changed, not since He made promises to Abraham, and certainly not since EMAS Canada was established in 1948. Going forward we face the challenge of establishing EMAS Canada as a sustainable ministry; changes may be as far-reaching as those of nomadic former slaves, turning into land owners. Time will tell; but we face them confidently, knowing that God's deep affection for us is steadfast, and His loyalty to us through the gospel is eternal.

BRINGING HEALING TO THREE GENERATIONS?

What do you do when you can't see because your eyelids will not open enough for you to see clearly? You live with the day-to-day challenges of trying to care for your child who has the same condition. Life is not easy, you trip over things and cannot see your surroundings clearly. What do you do when you believe that there is no help for you? What would you do when you hear that all hope is not lost?

Three generations of this family could not open their eyes more than a slit because there is no muscle to lift up the eyelids. They had to walk with their heads tilted backwards otherwise they would bump into

furniture and other obstacles.

Not knowing that they could be helped, and that their condition was treatable with corrective surgery, they gave up hope of a normal life.

When they heard about the EMAS China South Surgical Team and that there was a way to allow them to walk normally, they were skeptical at first however, they sent the mother to have the procedure done. She was delighted with the result and brought her son to have the same corrective surgery on his little eyes, in the hopes that he too would benefit from the life changing procedure. Her child can now walk without bumping into

obstacles and putting himself in harms way.

Now there is hope that the child's grandfather might also benefit from this, but a few obstacles lie in their way. They live in a remote village. The hospital charges do not include meals. Bus tickets to town and the cost of food is a significant amount to them. Therefore, they are reluctant to bring the grandfather in for treatment.

For only \$200 a donor can pay for the bus ticket and food for the family coming for treatment and be a part of sharing God's love and bringing hope to a family in need of healing.
